



## Covid 19 Risk Assessment

COVID-19 Management of the Garden and external areas - The risk from COVID-19 appears to be less high risk outside but good control measures are still required.

### PEOPLE EXPOSED

- Colleagues
- Contractors
- Visitors / Guests Members of the Public

### HAZARDS

- Spreading the virus to staff and to the wider public community If no controls are put in place within the garden area it could increase the risk of passing on to others the virus
- Slips trips and falls with more people in the garden the risk of slips and trips will increase
- Violence and aggression with more people in the garden area and being told where to sit and how to order the risk to the operator and staff of violence and aggression does increase, if no controls are in place
- Dealing with adverse weather

### CONTROL MEASURES

- Plenty of space in the garden and all garden tables socially distanced by over 2 meters. Customers will be told on being seated they can't move the tables and there will signs to reinforce this.

- Customers will enter through the main entrance where hand sanitiser will be situated.
- Play equipment will be taped off and out of use as we can't control social distancing with children
- Food & drink will be order at the bar with only one person from the group going to the bar to place order. Drinks will be placed on a tray and food served to the table when ready.
  - Cutlery will be given at time of ordering and condiments will be sachets
- The same principles for protecting staff that apply inside apply externally and the same serving techniques will be applied.
- Garden booking will only be taken on the day so as we are aware of the weather. Customers will be advised if weather changes, we can't guarantee seating inside.
