

Afternoon Tea at the Extraordinary Hare

Afternoon tea originated in England in the mid-19th century, specifically around 1840, and is widely credited to Anna Maria Russell, the seventh Duchess of Bedford.

the upper classes typically had only two main meals — a large breakfast and a late dinner around 8 pm — leaving a long gap that caused afternoon hunger (what the Duchess of Bedford called a "sinking feeling") around 4 o'clock.

To solve this, she started having tea, bread and butter, and cakes brought to her private rooms in the afternoon. soon becoming a popular British tradition.
