This exclusive area can seat 18 with an additional 10 standing, although this can be increased to 28 seated and 20 standing at certain times of the week, the area has free wifi, its own 55" TV and sound system. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What time are you open until?

*Our bar is open from
11.30am - 11.00pm Monday - Saturday
11.30am. - 10.30pm Sunday.
If an extension is needed we can arrange
that for a small fee.*

Do you allow exclusive hire of the whole pub?

Yes we do, although a minimum spend amount would need to be paid for in advance, please get in touch for more details.

Can I bring my own food and drink?

Unfortunately not, due to health & safety reasons. We do however allow you to bring a celebratory cake for the occasion. If you wish us to store it for you it's not a problem

Are dogs allowed?

Of course! We allow dogs in the pub and garden, please ask for a bowl of water or for a dog menu

Do we need a deposit?

Yes if you are booking an area of the pub but no if you are only booking a table or two

Are decorations allowed?

Absolutely! Please feel free to decorate your area or table however you wish. All we asks that you refrain from bringing confetti (as it's impossible to sweep up and we find it weeks later) and that you only use blue-tac when pinning up banners to avoid damage to the paint work
